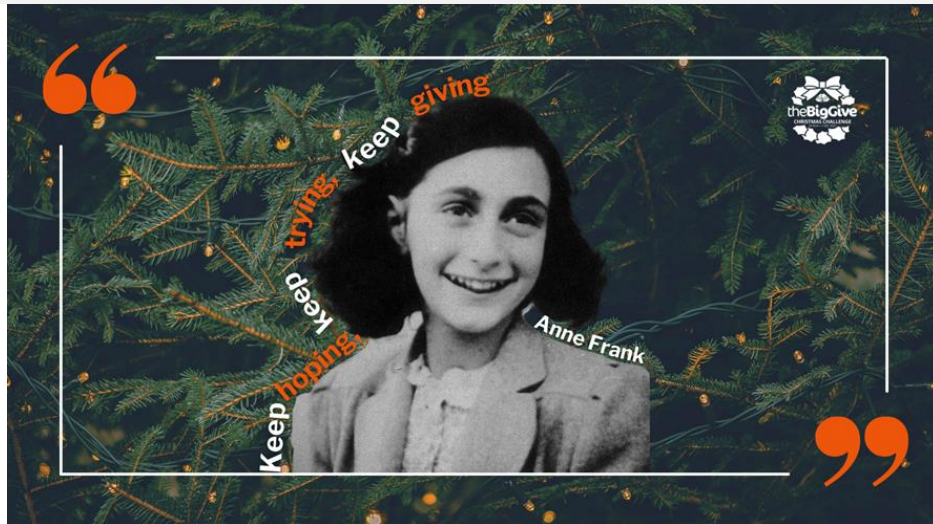

On 16 November we launched the brilliant results of our impact report.

We were pleased to be joined online by supporters and friends to share the key findings of our evaluation report for 2020-2021. And the evidence of our work's value is clear-**92.5% of**



young people surveyed improve in their attitudes towards at least one group of people different to themselves.

This is a brilliant result and was supported by the words of Aysha, Safa and Brooke, previous participants in our programme who shared their experiences.

"The Anne Frank exhibition opened me up to understand how much Jewish families went through...it gave me more of an ability to identify prejudice and feel like I could speak out against it" Brooke, Notre Dame High, Glasgow

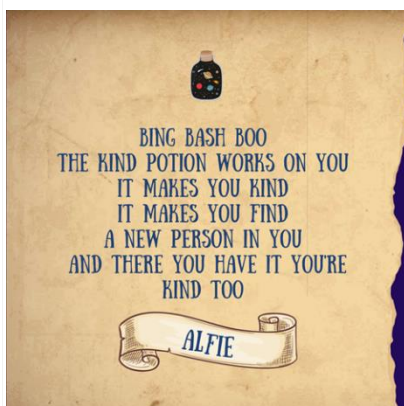

#ONEKINDWORD ONLINE EVENT

On 17 November we marked antibullying week online with poet Shagufta K Iqbal and author Onjali Rauf

More than 7,000 people joined us online for this event to learn more about what bullying is and how we can challenge it with kindness.

Onjali shared why kindness is so important in helping people feel included and welcome, especially for people who might be different from us, just like Ahmet in her book *The Boy at the Back of the Class*.

FUNDING NEWS



Thank you! The generous contributions of these organisations is supporting our anti-prejudice programmes in the UK.

Masonic Charitable Foundation

Generously providing 2 years of funding to support our Voices for Equality programme in Leeds and Salford. This funding will enable us to reach over 2,500 young people across 12 schools. Workshops and youth-led activities will tackle issues such as homophobia, extremism, bullying and online hate.

Department for Education

Funding our 'Different But The Same' project. A three year intensive anti-bullying project, which will provide training and support for 79,960 young people, their teachers and schools to tackle bullying. Through learning about Anne Frank's experiences and expanding this to other victimised groups, young people will learn to respect identity differences while recognising common humanity and anti-bullying values.

#iwill Fund

This fund will support our History for Today exhibition in deprived areas of Cumbria. Reaching 760 young people in 2 secondary schools and 150 primary school pupils. We will also deliver workshops with a focus on issues most relevant to students. Anne Frank Ambassadors will host community exhibitions to showcase their social action work, highlighting a local issue of prejudice or discrimination.

The funding comes from The Dulverton Trust, the National Lottery Community Fund and the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS). The #iwill Fund aims to enable young people to make a positive difference in their communities while developing their own skills and knowledge. NLCF and the DCMS are each investing £25 million seed funding to create the #iwill Fund. The Dulverton Trust is acting as a match funder and awarding grants on behalf of the #iwill Fund.
